2025: NEW CHALLENGES, NEW VICTORIES

In 2025, Los Angeles endured profound instability: neighborhoods burned in devastating wildfires, ICE raids destabilized communities, and the National Guard flooded our streets. Amidst this chaos, community violence intervention (CVI) organizations stood firm. While traditional systems faltered, Urban Peace Institute and our partners proved that community-led systems of care are the true stabilizers of public safety.

Now, this progress faces an existential threat. Federal funding cuts have slashed \$811 million in vital safety grants, undermining the very infrastructure that keeps our neighborhoods safe. But the data is clear: when organizations are funded to build capacity, they save lives. With more political uncertainty ahead, continued investment is essential to securing a powerful community-led safety infrastructure.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Since February 2024, Urban Peace Institute (UPI) has strengthened 18 Black- and Brown-led CVI organizations through the Los Angeles Peacemakers Initiative. This initiative leverages a strategic braid of \$9.6 million in public and private funding to provide essential capacity-building support and peacemaking activities. Through this project, CVI organizations have enrolled more than 1,500 new program participants and prevented over 1,300 potential acts of violence.

We are not merely funding temporary interventions; we are building a permanent safety infrastructure. Despite challenges in the landscape, LA Peacemakers Initiative organizations have achieved measurable progress toward reducing community violence while simultaneously building capacity to significantly expand the work.

PART 2: CAPACITY BUILDING

A unique objective of the LA Peacemakers Initiative is to professionalize and stabilize the CVI organizations. UPI's capacity building efforts seek to help organizations move beyond the "grant-to-grant" survival cycle by growing essential infrastructure and creating long-term self-sustainability. LA Peacemakers Initiative funding has supported 100 total positions, split nearly evenly between boots-on-the-ground presence and operational supports.
